### CONFORMATION JUDGE REBECCA PEEK

Milkwood IW, England



I was born into a family of dog lovers; my mother began breeding Miniature Long Haired Dachshunds in the early 1960s. When I was six I was allowed to choose my very own dog, so I asked a n Irish Wolfhound. Predictably.

answer was 'no' and I was told to choose something smaller, so I chose an Afghan Hound and there began a long association these most beautiful, but very high maintenance creatures. We bred the Afghans and Dachshunds for many years under the family affix Yansukhim, which one of my sisters still retains. Although we are no longer breeding either we still own them.

I never lost my longing for an Irish Wolfhound and in 1979 I eventually became the owner of my first and foundation bitch, who went on to become Ch Finloren Hester of Yansukhim, (Ch Erindale Triston x Sanctuary Sweet Erin), who was a general championship BIS winner. It was the beginning of a very long love affair with the breed and one that continues today.

When I bred from Hester I established my own kennel name Milkwood, and although I've been in the breed for nearly 40 years, do not breed very often and have never owned a large number at any one time – they are primarily companion animals and live in the house with me as one pack. So I feel very proud that from a very small number of dogs, so far I have bred and produced three further champions, Ch Milkwood Miss Pegotty O'Yansukhim, Ch Milkwood's Matti Richards and Ch Milkwood's Me Myself I, plus many other Reserve CC and award winning dogs. I have also owned and successfully shown Petit Bassets Griffon Vendeen.

Over the years I have had to balance my passion for the breed with work, which has always restricted my ability to breed and show more often.

I am passionate about health and longevity in the breed and also the need to nurture and bring on the next generation of wolfhound owners/breeders that will be the future guardians of the breed.

I am currently Chairman of the Irish Wolfhound Health Group, having been a former Treasurer and Secretary and founder member; I am also the breed's Kennel Club Breed Health coordinator and have served on the Committee for the Irish Wolfhound Society and several General Dog Show Societies – I am also Secretary for a Ploughing Society in my spare time!

In the UK, I am approved to judge both Irish Wolfhounds and Petit Bassets Griffon Vendeen at Challenge Certificate level and have judged Irish Wolfhounds in Scandinavia and Europe. I also enjoy handling show dogs and have also handled for others in the UK and Europe.

I am honoured to have been invited to judge at your show and look forward to meeting you all and your hounds – it will be my first visit to Canada so I am very excited!

#### **Judges' Comments**

I'd like to thank the IWCC, BC Branch for inviting me to judge your specialty, it was an honour and a huge pleasure. I have to say that the officers and committee do a great job in looking after we judges – the hospitality is second to none, and the whole weekend had a relaxed and friendly atmosphere, a great introduction to Canada for me!

A big thank you, also, to show photographer Carol Petersen for downloading the pictures so quickly for me, I can see why the show was dedicated to you – lovely shots and a wonderful record of the day that has given me a really pleasurable few hours looking through with the catalogue. Thanks also to my Ring Steward, Lesley Schreuder, who guided me through the programme for the day and kept me and the ring on track – along with a very efficient support team sorting out the many wonderful awards!

It's always a privilege to be allowed to judge other people's hounds and always a joy to go over the dogs, especially when they are completely unknown to you. So thank you to everyone who brought their dogs under me, I was delighted with the quality of the entry.

There was a lot of consistency throughout, which when I looked at the catalogue and saw how related many of them are, is hardly surprising. Overall, the hounds were sound on the move, with good temperaments and there were many of good size and type with the overall shape and leg length needed for a galloping sighthound. Ideally, I am looking for an athletic and capable sighthound that is fit for function, powerful and workman like without being overdone or coarse and there were several that fitted the bill. I was pleased to see plenty of lovely sighthound heads with neat, well placed ears, good skull proportions and good eye shape and set - and there were plenty of good bites with large, strong, clean teeth set in strong jaws. If I have a general criticism, it is that there were a lot of light eyes and in an ideal world I would always prefer to see a dark eye, regardless of the colour of the dog. However, it is only one fault and does not stop an otherwise good hound fulfilling its function - for me, it's a nicety, not an absolute necessity.

I got the best of both worlds, years of enjoyment out of wolfhounds and a husband that is a true partner in my passion. Over the years my husband and I have had 25+ litters and 33+ champions that I can recall. I have traveled to various shows abroad including the world show a few years ago. I love my hounds very much, however as a breeder I am always striving to improve the breed for everybody to enjoy happy, healthy, long lived kind souls.
